Re: Members Expenses

I am prompted to write to you following a recent communication from the Speaker. I along with millions of the voting public am appalled at the outrageous claims by some members of the House. I personally feel that only a complete break with the present system will suffice. I would like you to consider the following options:

The members salary, must be commensurate with their responsibility to the electorate.

Members should be provided with suitable accommodation by the state. Possibly, converting empty office blocks in Docklands, into fully furnished luxury apartments. This accommodation could be pre booked as required and rented free of charge.

The Members could claim First Class rail travel to and from the House. An environmentally preferred option of travel.
